CARE AND COMPASSION

How should I vote on Friday 25th May?

The first thing to remember is that this is a legal issue; your vote will be enshrined in the Constitution; because that is what you are doing – you are voting to change the Constitution! You are voting to either retain or repeal one article in our Constitution. That article is called the 8th Amendment.

The wording of the 8th Amendment reads as follows: "The State acknowledges the right to life of the unborn and with due regard to the equal right to life of the mother, guarantees in its laws to respect and, as far as practicable, by its laws, to defend and vindicate that right."

That seems straightforward. So what will happen if you vote to repeal the 8th? If the 8th Amendment is repealed the right to life for unborn children in Ireland will be without legal constitutional protection. This would radically change the principle, for all unborn children and indeed for all of us, that the right to life is a fundamental human right. Further, the 8th will be replaced by new wording which will give the Dáil the right to change the law!! If it is a 'YES' vote, you will no longer have any say in the matter. It will be in the Constitution. And the right to change that law will pass to the politicians.....That's right, the politicians will be able to change the agreed wording.

A "Yes" vote means you change the Constitution. A "No" vote means you keep the Constitution as it is.

Bishop Brendan Leahy says, "It really is important for us to affirm that what is in the womb are babies that are just not born yet. They are not potential persons but persons with potential"

The Catholic Church is strongly in favour of retaining the 8th Amendment as it is now. Think hard and pray hard before you cast your vote.

Living your Life – with Epilepsy

Even though an estimated 65 million people worldwide have epilepsy, a neurological condition of the brain that causes seizures, not many people in the spotlight speak openly about the condition. Well known people - writers, athletes, entertainers and more- who lived with a seizure disorder at one point in their life include Vincent Van Gogh, Theodore Roosevelt, Charles Dickens, Neil Young, Prince and Susan Boyle. This condition, affecting 1 in 30 Irish people, most commonly starts in childhood and in people aged over 60. In general, seizures are well controlled by treatment in about 4 in 5 cases & those with the condition can by in large live 'normal' lives. Educating ourselves about epilepsy can help reduce the stigma of the condition (previously linked to mental health difficulties) and ease the burden on epilepsy sufferers and their families.

What is a seizure? A seizure is a short episode of symptoms caused by a burst of abnormal electrical activity in the brain. Typically, a seizure lasts from a few seconds to a few minutes. Different parts of the brain control different parts and functions of the body. Therefore, the symptoms that occur during a seizure depend on where the abnormal burst of electrical activity occurs. Symptoms that may occur during a seizure can affect muscles, sensations, behaviour, emotions, consciousness or a combination of these.

What is epilepsy? If you have epilepsy, it means that you have had repeated seizures. If you have a single seizure, it does not necessarily mean that you have epilepsy (e.g a child who has a febrile convulsion – a seizure due to a high temperature). About 1 person in 20 has a seizure at some time in their life. The frequency of seizures in people with epilepsy varies. In some cases there may be years between seizures, for others they occur everyday. The type of seizure most people would know as epilepsy is a '**tonic-clonic**' seizure – when a person loses consciousness and the whole body stiffens and shakes. Other types include '**absence**' seizures – where a person (usually a child) experiences a brief loss of consciousness or awareness, '**myoclonic**' seizures whereby a sudden contraction of the muscles causes limbs to jerk, or '**atonic**' seizures where you become limp and collapse, otherwise known as a 'drop attack'.

What causes epilepsy? In many cases, no cause for the seizures can be found. It is unclear why they start or continue to occur. Medication to control seizures usually works very well. In other cases, an underlying brain condition or brain damage causes epilepsy. Some conditions are present at birth (e.g. cerebral palsy) or in other cases the condition develop later in life (e.g stroke/head injury/brain tumour). The condition may irritate the surrounding brain cells and trigger seizures.

What triggers a seizure? There is often no apparent reason why a seizure occurs at one time and not at another. Occasionally, stress, tiredness, alcohol, flickering lights or medication can trigger an attack. Although usually a clinical diagnosis based on history, tests to confirm the diagnosis include a brain MRI and EEG (electroencephalogram – a tracing of brain activity).

What are the treatments for epilepsy? Epilepsy cannot be cured with medication. However, with the right type and strength of medication, the majority of people with epilepsy do not have seizures. The medicines work by stabilising the electrical activity of the brain. Other treatments for epilepsy include **surgery** to remove a small part of the brain which is the underlying cause of the epilepsy, possible in only a small number of suffers. Surgical techniques continue to improve and surgery may become an option for more and more people in the future. **In addition vagal nerve stimulation** is a treatment for epilepsy, where a small generator is implanted under the skin below the left collarbone. The vagus nerve is stimulated to reduce the frequency and intensity of seizures. This can be suitable for some people with seizures that are difficult to control with medication.

The overall outlook is better than many people realise. About 5 in 10 people with epilepsy will have no seizures at all over a five-year period.



What to do if you see someone having a seizure

If you see someone having a seizure or fit, there are some simple things you can do to help. You should call an ambulance if you know it's their first seizure or it's lasting longer than 5 minutes. It might be scary to witness, but don't panic

If you're with someone having a seizure:

- only move them if they're in danger – such as near a busy road or hot cooker
- cushion their head and loosen any tight clothing around their neck
- when their convulsions stop, turn them so they lie on their side (recovery position)
- stay with them and talk to them calmly until they recover
- note the time the seizure starts and finishes

Don't put anything in their mouth, including your fingers. They shouldn't have any food or drink until they fully recover.

When to call an ambulance

Dial 999 and ask for an ambulance if:

- it's the first time someone has had a seizure
- the seizure lasts for more than 5 minutes
- the person doesn't regain full consciousness, or has several seizures without regaining consciousness
- the person is seriously injured during the seizure

People with epilepsy don't always need to go to hospital every time they have a seizure.

DID YOU KNOW? The Greek philosopher Hippocrates (460-377 BC) was the first person to suggest that epilepsy starts in the brain. In the US, one person is diagnosed with epilepsy every 4 minutes.



As you may or may not be aware, changes are afoot in relation to how your personal data is stored, accessed, shared and processed. The law governing this comes from the European Union and is complex, but in essence it regulates data controllers and provides rights to data subjects. In practice, it means that companies, including those based outside the EU but processing personal data from within, will have to be exceptionally careful with how they collect and share a person's data. It also means that the individual will have vastly strengthened rights regarding how their personal data is requested and used. The new law will be invoked on the 25th of May 2018 and it will replace previous laws from 1998 & 2003. Medical practitioners (GPs, hospitals etc) are data controllers- put simply - responsible for important personal data that is held on file about you and are taking substantive steps to ensure the confidentiality, accuracy and security of your individual files.

COËTIVY BOOK OF HOURS EXHIBITION



A small personal prayer book, so cherished that it has survived almost six centuries, is on display at Chester Beatty Library in Dublin.

The lavishly illuminated Coëtivy Book of Hours is

one of the greatest works of art in existence. Commissioned by the Admiral of France for his wedding in the mid-15th century, it was then acquired by Chester Beatty's wife Edith as a wedding anniversary gift for her husband in 1919.

The exhibition features 144 illuminations from the Masterpiece - page after page of glorious paintings in gold and other precious materials (see sample above).

Having experienced the latest Spring I can remember let's hope we have a long warm and sunny Summer in 2018.

Spring/Beach Clean The programme commenced on 14th April and will continue every second Saturday until September. We meet at the Kiosk at 10.00am. We welcome new volunteers. No skills required. We provide litter pickers and bags. Great free coffee and scones in the Portmarnock Hotel after the work. With all the storms we have experienced in early 2018 there is a large accumulation of debris on the beach and in the rocks that will take some time to clear. All assistance is gratefully accepted.

Tidy Towns The Tidy Town judges will be visiting Portmarnock at any time from the 1st June onwards. While it may be a little early for the flowers it would be great if all the beds are cleared and ready for planting by then. If there are bare patches on the grass verge in front of your or your neighbour's house we will be happy to supply you with grass seed and fertiliser to "green it up". As in 2017 Fingal County Council Parks Dept. will be supplying us with flowers for the beds in early June. If you need flowers contact me in the next two weeks so that I can arrange to get a supply for your road or estate.

I am glad to see the new areas of daffodils in flower at the entrance to Torcaill and at the Southern Cross monument. The new bed in Carrick Court will be planted up shortly and the renovation work on Potato Skin Lane should be completed by now.

We will be planting up the planters/boxes in the village in early June with summer flowers. We need all the help we can get – leave a message on my mobile if you can assist us.

Shelter/Promenade I mentioned in the last issue that the long awaited renovation works on shelters would be starting in April. Due to the cold weather and other issues it will be mid-May before any works commence. Hopefully I will not be mentioning this again until it is finished.

Display Boards We have made good progress in developing boards and website information on Baldoyle Special Area of Conservation, The Sluice River Marsh, The Geology Walk along the coast and our History Information Points. We hope to have everything in place by mid-Summer

Drone Photographs We commissioned a series of photographs taken by a drone over most areas of the

village in the past two months. We will have them on display on the website www.portmarnock.org in the next few weeks. It provides for a totally different perspective to our normal view of the village.

FINGAL MATTERS

Running Track in Portmarnock

Progress has been made to identifying a suitable site for a shared use Athletics Track with local Sports clubs and schools in the Portmarnock area and to move towards agreeing the provision of a site. The manager issued the following Report to a motion asking to help clubs identify and develop a site: *"Discussions have taken place with the local Athletics Club in respect of their plans to develop a suitable facility. They currently are using a prepared grass track at Carrickhill as part of their overall activities. Further discussions have been held with Planning and Strategic Infrastructure in an effort to identify possible locations not yet in Council ownership which may provide a potential location and these discussions are ongoing. The Council is supportive of the Club's efforts in this regard and will continue to try to help facilitate them in their ambitions."*

The development of the facility should allow access for multiple clubs and schools in the Area.

Station Road Drumnigh Road Junction.

The following questions and answers were received at the area committee meeting in April

"To ask the Chief Executive to identify and execute a solution for the safety problems being caused by heavy goods vehicles mounting the pavement at Station Road, and to examine the possibility of a road widening in view of the planned development for the area?"

Reply: *The area will be examined to determine if any low cost safety measures can be carried out to alleviate the issues identified. The area will also be referred on to the Planning and Strategic Infrastructure Department for consideration in respect of any future developments being carried out in this area.*

Council Move to LED lightbulbs saves '000s

In 2016 Fingal replaced 2850 residential street lights with LED lighting giving energy savings totalling €78,000. In 2017 a further 2425 LEDs gave a saving of €62,000 in energy costs. The accumulated energy saving over the 2 year period totals €218,000. Further maintenance savings will be realised over the lifetime of each LED installed. Fingal is continuing to accelerate its programmes which will also help reduce carbon footprint.

Hole in Wall Road Moyne Road realignment.

The Compulsory Purchase Order documentation for this scheme is currently being finalised, following which it will be submitted to An Bord Pleanála. Depending on objections, the timeframe for submission and decision of the application will be approximately six months. In parallel to the CPO application, a specification for an advanced archaeology investigation contract is being prepared, the detail design drawings are nearing completion and the tendering prequalification process for suitable works contractors will be undertaken. On the successful granting of permission, the second stage of contractor procurement will be undertaken and the contractor will be appointed


